## Explanation of Methodology

1. The delegations to the State Convention and Assembly were based upon each county's vote for Governor in the 2006 General Election. The Party divided a base of 5000 delegates among the counties according to each county's share of the statewide total. For counties that did not receive at least 4 delegates under this calculation, their delegate total was increased to the county minimum of 4 delegates; those counties are indicated by the shading in the delegate table.
2. The delegations for the Congressional Districts and other multi-county districts are the same as for the State Convention and Assembly if the county is wholly within the district. (Note that an apportionment is not necessary for single-county districts, as these assemblies are comprised of all of the delegates to the county assembly within those districts.)
3. For counties in Congressional Districts and other multi-county districts which are split by those districts, the delegation numbers were determined by the following formulas. Where the formula resulted in a county receiving only one delegate, the number was increased to the split county minimum of two delegates. Multiple formulas exist due to the lack of data available in many counties, primarily due to "vote centers" resulting in no precinct-level data being reportable. The following list is in priority order of the formula used (i.e., if formula [a] can be used, that will be used; if formula [a] cannot be used, formula [b] will be attempted, and so on). Data is data provided to the State Party from the Colorado Secretary of State.
  - a. If the county clerk and recorder provides precinct-level data, and further includes absentee, early voting, and provisional ballots in that precinct-level data (i.e., Boulder, Weld, Adams, etc.), the numbers are split according to the vote for Governor in each of the districts involved.
  - b. If the county clerk and recorder provides precinct-level data, but does not include absentee, early voting, or provisional ballots in that data (i.e., Arapahoe, Jefferson, etc.), the numbers are split by adding the district's share of the county's votes that are not assigned to a precinct to the district total from the precincts, using the following formula:

$$d + ((d/t) \times (t-p))$$

where:

d = total number of votes in the district from precinct-level data

t = total number of votes for Governor cast in the county

$p$  = total number of votes cast for Governor that have been assigned to a precinct

- c. If the county clerk and recorder does not provide any precinct-level data (i.e., Larimer, etc.), or where the county clerk and recorder provides precinct-level data that appears to combine congressional districts within precincts (i.e., Otero and Park), the multi-county districts are split based on the district's vote for the district candidate as compared to the total vote within the county for all candidates of that type of district. For example, in Park County, the Congressional District delegation is apportioned between CD6 and CD5 based on the votes for Bill Winter and Jay Fawcett, respectively. In Larimer County, the delegation numbers for Larimer County's delegation to HD49 is based on the Larimer County vote for the HD49 candidate in 2006 in comparison to all State House candidates in Larimer County in 2006.
